NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION

Project Name or Number: Environmental Review ER08-0006

Project Description: The proposed project consists of the construction of the Allan Hancock College Bike Path Extension, which will be approximately 1.0-miles long, beginning 800-feet north of the "H" Street/Santa Ynez River bridge. From this point, the alignment will head west for about 50-feet, turn north, parallel to Highway 1, then turn west along the northern boundary of the Lompoc Federal Correctional Complex (FCC) property agricultural fields, then turn northwest and north to the Lompoc FCC boundary. The alignment will then turn east and northeast, crossing onto the City of Lompoc's Ken Adam Park property and ending at the south terminus of Hancock Drive.
