

## **PARK MAINTENANCE**

The Parks Division, under the direction of Parks, Recreation and Urban Forestry Manager, Cindy McCall, maintains over 500 acres of City parks, public facility grounds, parkways, and open space. City parks are open to the public daily from 7:30 am until dusk.

## **PARK RESERVATIONS**

Large groups are encouraged to reserve City park group picnic areas and BBQ pits. Group picnic facilities are available at Ryon Park, Beattie Park, Ken Adam Park and River Park. These group areas can accommodate large groups up to 150 persons. Please complete facility reservation forms at the Anderson Recreation Center, 125 W. Walnut Ave., between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday. Smaller individual tables and braziers are available on a first-come, first-served basis in all parks. ## **FACILITIES**

The Lompoc Parks, Recreation, and Urban Forestry Department has various facilities and rooms available for rent. Rental facilities include the Anderson Recreation Center, accommodating 30-225 people for special events, exhibition, meetings, etc., and the Civic Auditorium, with a seating capacity of 430 for performing arts, seminars, meetings, etc. Rates will vary depending on the size of the facility needed, the type of activity and the length of the activity. ## **URBAN FORESTRY**

The Urban Forestry Division plants and maintains over 250 miles of median or public right-of-way along city streets. This division also provides landscape maintenance along V Street, Olive Avenue, portions of Central Avenue and D Street. Medians on D and H Streets, along with the downtown flowerbeds, are included in landscape maintenance schedules. Requests for service can be made by calling 875-8034, from 7:00 am to 3:30 pm on weekdays.

## **NEW CITY TREE PLANTING PROGRAM**

The city of Lompoc Urban Forestry Division has established a program for citizens to request that a street tree be planted at their residence. Each residence is allowed one tree per 30-40 feet of street frontage based on the tree selected. This program is offered at no cost to the public, providing the tree is planted on a city street. Citizens are only asked to assist with watering. The City provides all other maintenance. To make a street tree request, call 875-8034.

## **BEATTIE PARK RECOGNITION GROVE**

You can honor that special individual who has made significant contributions to the quality of life in the Lompoc Valley. An application and a brief narrative including a listing of achievements, contributions and/or service to the community must be submitted by December 1st each year. The application will be reviewed and must be approved by a sub-committee before a tree and permanent bronze plaque can be installed in the Recognition Grove. The Beautification and Appearance Commission will approve a maximum of four applications each year. Remaining applications will be returned to the sponsor or held for the next year's review and consideration. Once the Commission has approved the applications, they are forwarded to the City Clerk who prepares an official resolution commending the individual. Persons to be cited as members of Recognition Grove are acknowledged at the annual Arbor Day ceremony, held each spring. At that time, the resolution is presented to the individual. Cypress Avenue and H Street – Benches, LVAA Cypress Gallery, gazebo.

### COLLEGE PARK

College Avenue and J Street – Skatepark & Lompoc Family YMCA

### J. M. PARK

Chestnut Avenue and A Street – Playground, individual BBQ’s, basketball court, Little League baseball field, lighted baseball field.

### KEN ADAM PARK

Astronaut Memorials, Flag Monument, Group BBQ’s, playground, restrooms, water, electrical access, and resident Park Ranger.

### LOMPOC VALLEY MULTIPURPOSE TRAIL

This multipurpose trail is approximately 2.25 mile long, connecting most of the North to South distance between the northeastern edge of the City and the southeastern edge of the City.

### PIONEER PARK

Pine Avenue. and 4th Street – Tot lot, individual BBQ’s, Babe Ruth baseball field, and park.

### RIVER PARK

Highway 246 and Sweeney Road – Playground, horseshoe pits, fitness trail, Kiwanis Lake, sand volleyball courts, full hookup campground, group camping area, Kiwanis Kwik Fitness, Vietnam Veterans Memorial, American Legion Group BBQ, Kiwanis Group BBQ, Oddfellows Group BBQ, Lutheran Group BBQ area, El Concilio Group BBQ area, individual BBQ’s, resident Park Ranger and Campground Host

### RIVERBEND PARK

McLaughlin Road and A Street Babe Ruth baseball field, group BBQ area, athletic fields and Park Host

### RYON PARK

Ocean Avenue and O Street – Tot lot, group BBQ area, lighted softball field, baseball field, athletic field, tennis courts, stage, individual BBQ’s, resident Park Ranger.

### THOMPSON PARK

College Avenue and R Street – Playground, softball field, individual BBQ’s.

### WESTVALE PARK

West Fir Avenue – Tot lot and playground, individual BBQ’s.

### Looking to Stay Fit?

Looking to stay fit....try one of our walking or fitness trails in your neighborhood City Parks

RYON PARK walking trail is 1330 feet, just 10 feet over 1/4 mile

BEATTIE PARK walking and fitness trail is 2172 feet, 468 shy of a 1/2 mile

RIVER PARK’S walking trail is 5138 feet in length, which is 142 short of a mile.
